Has America Forgotten its Founding Principles?

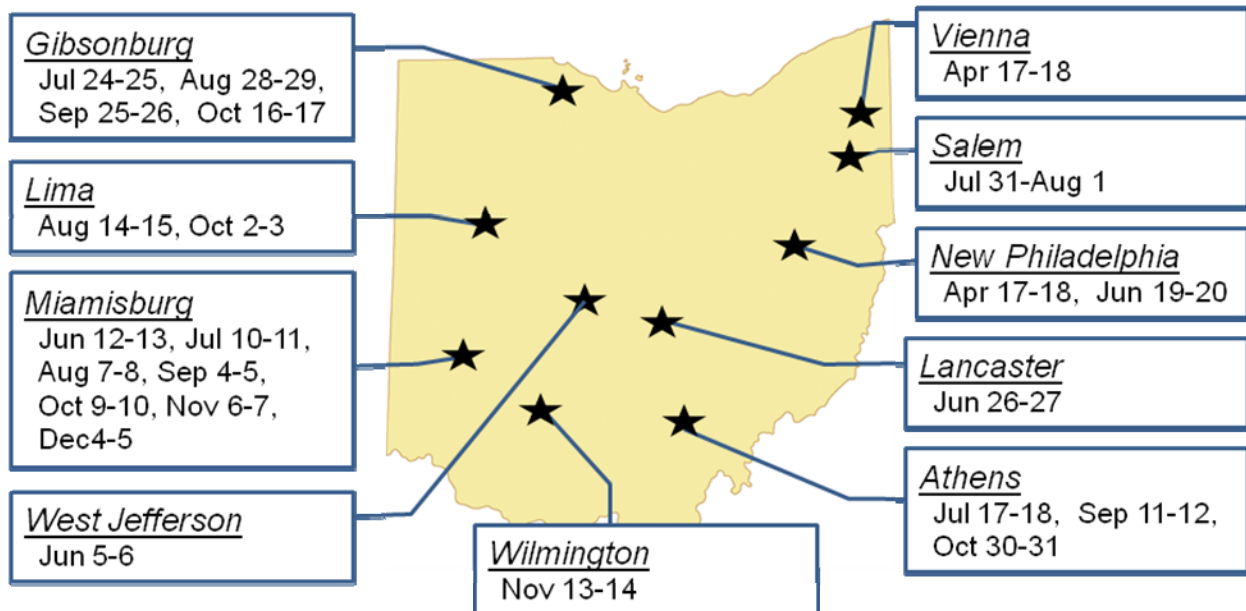

Over 1000 Appleseed events will be held in 2010 from coast to coast and border to border. At these two-day, family-friendly events, participants will learn from our qualified instructors what transpired on April 19, 1775, when the first official shots of America's Revolutionary War were fired in Lexington and Concord. Attendees of all skill levels will also receive world-class instruction regarding the safe and effective use of a rifle out to 500 yards. Everyone, whether Beginner or Expert, will learn together!

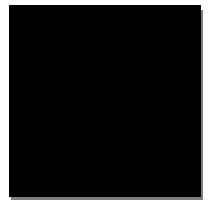

Take the Rifleman challenge... if you dare!

- Cut-out and place this card at 82 feet (25 meters)
- Load 10 rounds
- Get into the prone position using only a sling for support (no bi-pods or rests allowed)
- Fire all ten rounds in less than 60 seconds.

Quick Answers to Appleseed Questions

What is Project Appleseed? It is a program that instructs people in rifle marksmanship using rack-grade rifles and surplus ball ammo. It is also a program intended to revitalize the tradition of the Rifleman.

Who should attend? Appleseed instruction is perfect for the novice as well as the experienced shooter. There is something for all to learn.

Why "Appleseed"? "Appleseed" comes from Johnny Appleseed, the American folk hero who walked the country planting apple seeds, not for himself, but for future generations.

What kind of rifle do I need? You can use any safe firearm, which can be accurately shot from the shoulder, from .22 rim fire to .32 (8mm). While semi-auto friendly, we are not unfriendly to bolt guns.

What kinds of sights are allowed? Appleseed has no sight / optic restrictions - you can use ANY.

Which caliber is best? They all are. Appleseed is not caliber specific.

How much ammo do I need? It is best to bring around 250 rounds per day.

How much does it cost to attend? \$70 for two days with pre-registration and that includes a free T-shirt. \$45 for one day only. Some ranges charge a minimal range fee, usually \$5-10/day. There is a \$10 walk on fee if you do not pre-register. Ladies, shooters under 21, and Active Duty/Reserve/Guard with MIL ID shoot FREE

Why military rifles? Because they are fast, easy to reload, and reliable

Do I need a sling? Yes. A military style web sling. Nothing fancy is required.

Can I use a bipod? We teach the fundamental shooting positions: standing, sitting/kneeling and prone, using a sling. But, bring what you have.

Do you have a checklist of things to do in preparation for a shoot? Yes, look at: www.appleseedinfo.org

Can kids come? Yes, responsible junior shooters are welcome and shoot free.

Where can I get more information? There are schedules, equipment lists and much more on our website.

Where events are scheduled this year? We will have almost 1000 events this year nationwide and 24 events currently scheduled for Ohio (but, more are expected!).

Can I just show up and register for a shoot? Yes, but there is a \$10 walk on fee. Pre-registration allows us to schedule our instructors most effectively. If you do not have internet access, send your entry fee of \$45/\$70 along with your shirt size, name, address and phone number, date and place you want to register for to: RWVA, POB 756, Ramseur, NC 27316.
