



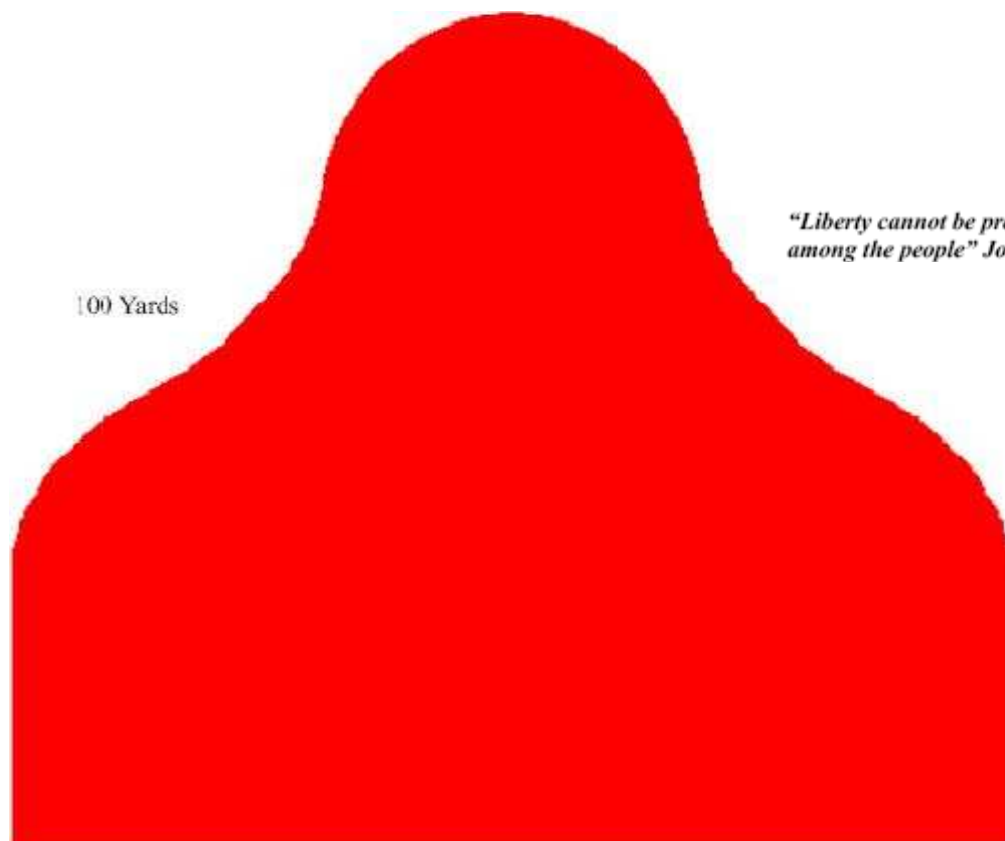
The Tradition of the American Rifleman

Can you uphold the Tradition of the American Rifleman?

The famed American Rifleman from the Revolutionary War could make a head shot at 250 yards with a muzzle loading rifle and basic iron sights.

Certainly, with today's rifles, that American Rifleman could do even better... but can you meet the standard our founding fathers laid down over 200 years ago?

All you need is a 50 foot range with a safe backstop, a rifle – any rifle – and this target. Shoot from any position, three shots at each target. The reduced-size targets mimic the sight picture at various ranges. The goal is all three shots into each target.

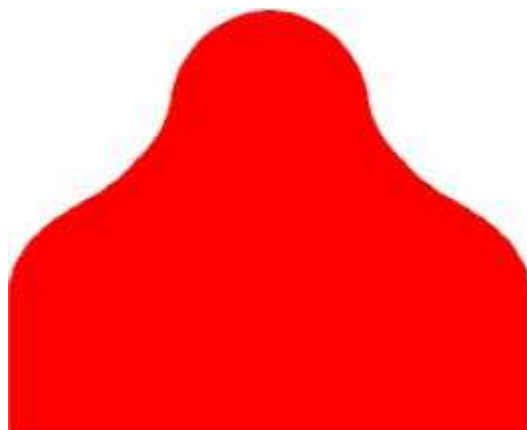

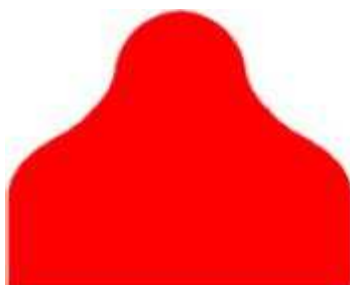

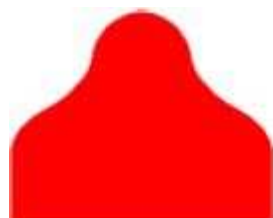
If you're using a Revolutionary War rifle, this is your expert mark!
