
### After Action Report: August 7<sup>th</sup> Picnic



## **Heroes of Early America: The Marquis de Lafayette**

In July of 1777 a nineteen-year-old French aristocrat arrived in Philadelphia to offer his services, free of charge, as a Major General in the Continental Army. Congress wanted to turn him away as yet another French glory-seeker, until they received Benjamin Franklin's recommendation letter from France. Lafayette became a much-loved military leader during the American Revolution, as well as a close friend of George Washington. His leadership contributed to the success of many key battles.

His strong beliefs in Enlightenment ideals led him to leave a comfortable and privileged life, buy a ship, travel to another continent, and share the fortunes of the Continental Army of a fledgling nation founded on the principles of Liberty. He also used diplomacy to convince the French king to support America in the War for Independence, starting in 1778.

Soon after the victory at Yorktown in 1781, which was the last large battle of the American Revolution, Lafayette wrote, "Humanity has won its battle. Liberty now has a country."

He was so famous in America that numerous cities, counties, streets, schools, and parks are named after him, including Lafayette, Louisiana and Fayetteville, North Carolina. Most of these names came about after his 1824-25 visits to all 24 American states, at the invitation of President James Monroe to celebrate the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our nation.
