Thank You to One of Our Host Ranges: The Winona Sportsmen's Club

The Winona Sportsmen's Club range was the site of the first Appleseed in the State of Minnesota, on September 5th & 6th, 2008. Since then, Winona has hosted several more Appleseeds, as well as providing a home for the first Minnesota Instructor Boot Camp (IBC). All previous Appleseed events at Winona have featured a sell-out crowd and we hope that this tradition will continue in 2011.



The club is sits on approximately 100 acres of ridge top overlooking the scenic bluff lands of the Mississippi River Valley. The Winona Club's history begins somewhere in the early 1900s. No one knows for sure when it was first formed, but the club does have a membership card that dates back to 1918.

Facilities include a 100 yard rifle/pistol range, trap range with 5 trap houses, and one of the only skeet ranges in the area.

The annual membership runs approximately 350 members with about half of these being "Life" members. Dues are \$300/lifetime, \$30/annual, and a \$5 daily fee for non-members.



What is Patriot's Day?

Patriot's Day is a state holiday in Massachusetts and Maine, marking the anniversary of the battles of Lexington and Concord on April 19, 1775. This is when the "shot heard round the world" was fired, and is the day the American Revolution officially began. Patriot's Day is celebrated on the third Monday in April, which is April 18th this year.

In Concord, Massachusetts, they take Patriot's Day very seriously and celebrate it on the actual date – April 19th. Minuteman reenactor groups assemble at dawn and march to the Old North Bridge where they face off in a gun battle with a troop of Redcoat reenactors.

Thousands of people flock to Lexington and Concord and Minute Man National Historical Park to celebrate the holiday. The entire weekend is filled with parades, reenactments and commemorative ceremonies.

Heroes of Early America

On April 19, 1775, a rider on a pale horse came from Woburn and repeatedly engaged the British Regulars all along their retreat from Concord. The Regulars later referred to him in their writings as "DEATH." Who was this man, the sight of whom struck terror into seasoned troops and officers alike? He was Hezekiah Wyman. This day was his birthday, and he had just turned 55.

His wife told him he was too old to serve. But he mounted his strong white horse, advanced to the location of the retreating Regulars, jumped off, laid his musket barrel over his saddle, and used his effective marksmanship with deadly effect. All day he remounted, rode further on, and repeated his feat. He emerged from this day completely unscathed, despite the Regulars' best efforts to take him down.
