On April 19th, 1775; 700 British soldiers marched out of Boston with orders to seize arms and munitions from their colonial subjects. A few miles down the road they were met with opposition, as the men of Lexington had formed up on the town green. Outnumbered 10 to 1, the colonists stood defiantly as the 'redcoats' came upon them...

What you should bring:

A desire to learn and improve.
A rifle (and a spare, if you have it. -Cleaned and lubed)
Ammunition: At least 250 rounds per day.
Scope OK. GI web sling strongly recommended.
Eye and ear protection. Mat or ground cloth.
Hat and sunscreen. Appropriate clothing for all weather.
Water, lunch, snacks. Some friends!

What you can expect:

New Shooters - learn fundamentals and make quick progress.
Experienced Shooters - learn techniques to tighten your groups.
Expert Shooters - polish your shooting AND teaching skills.
Everyone - expect to have a great time!

You will leave the event with all the skills necessary to own "The Rifleman's Quarter-mile" along with a renewed sense of what it means to be an American!

One-Day events cost: \$40 for adults - \$15 youths under 18 yrs

Two Day events cost: \$60 for adults - \$20 youths under 18 yrs
