

GSW Trauma and Management

Instructor Franklin R. comes from a career background in emergency medical and trauma care and crisis management. Brings us a class geared towards the responsible armed citizen, the sheepdog, the provider and protectors of our families. For those who train with the gun, who rely upon the gun as a source of security, it only makes sense to understand the wounds they can create and how to treat them in the event of accidental shooting, or the ill-fated violent encounter.



Any racecar driver understands the need for seat belt, roll cage, and fire extinguisher because the inherent dangers of his activities. Any shooter or sheepdog that would run towards harm's way to shield those running away MUST be well versed in immediate medical treatments and lifesaving procedures.

Prior experience in first aid recommended but not required. In this class, students will learn basic concepts of emergency casualty care, learn how to assemble, maintain, and use their own personal trauma kits to begin treatment of the downed operator. Tuition includes a personal "Immediate Action Kit", which contains a variety of medical items necessary to address and treat the "Big 3" (Hemorrhage, Pneumothorax, Airway Obstruction) associated with penetrating trauma wounds. Students will also be certified in CPR and receive a certification from the American Heart Association that is valid for 2 years.

Additional courses include Heartsaver CPR/AED (3hr), Heartsaver First Aid/CPR (8hr), Basic Life Support for the Health Care Provider (5hr), Wilderness First Aid (16hr), and First Responder (40hr). All courses are taught by American Heart Association and/or American Safety and Health Institute certified instructors currently practicing in the field with emergency medical and trauma care experience.
