Everything you need to know to engage a 20" target out to 500 yards or the Rifleman's Quarter Mile.

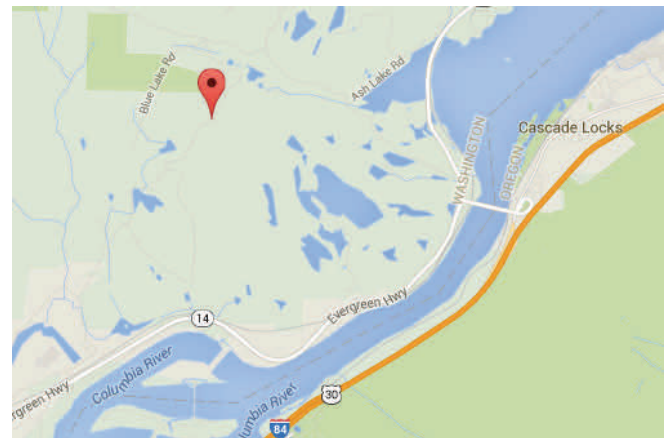
What to bring

- A rifle—anything up to 8mm. Our suggestion is a semi auto, magazine fed, with adjustable sights (or scope) and an adjustable sling (GI style web sling is ideal). 22LR is okay
- Ammo—about 400 rounds
- A teachable attitude—even if you 'know how to shoot' let us add some tools to your range bag
- Eye and Ear protection
- A shooting matt or carpet remnant to lay on
- A sack lunch, water & high protein snacks
