

Appleseed Marksmanship Clinic at SSSC

Seven lucky shooters spent two days of rifle marksmanship instruction with master instructor Jim “Lotti” Heath, the “shoot boss” for the event, at the Sangre Shooting Sports Club’s (SSSC) facility south of Westcliffe. The participants shot their semi-automatic rifles, both rimfire and centerfire, at various targets over the weekend as Jim Heath taught them the finer points of marksmanship. Jim is the head Appleseed instructor for Colorado. He was ably assisted by Copper Gulch resident, Tommy “Da Spook” Kravitz, an assistant Appleseed instructor. One of the goals of the weekend is to pass the “AQT” test (the Army Qualification Test) with a score over 210 which means you will receive the treasured Appleseed “Rifleman” patch.
