### **Things that can be done now:**

4. See if your town/state has a community calendar for newspaper, TV, Radio, and Internet. Put an announcement in there.

### **Things to be done just prior to the event:**

1. Check with the range or land owner to see that everything is in place as agreed.
  - a. Gate unlocked,
  - b. Targets in place if the range is providing them.
  - c. Restroom facilities/porta-potties in place
  - d. All other details as agreed too.
2. If range is not providing the targets, get help to put them up. RWVA has directions for T-post and wire target holders, but they should be up and in place before 8am the day of the shoot
3. Meet with RWVA staff to go over any last minute details
4. Come and enjoy learning to be a Rifleman.
